Jim Brown started his musical experience by playing the trombone in his elementary, intermediate and high school bands and singing in various choral groups throughout his school years. Jim began studying the organ in early 1974 at the age of 18. His organ studies were self- taught initially. Jim then studied classical organ and piano with Terry Compton of Roseville, CA, and has also studied with Donna Crosson of Shingle Springs, CA.

His first professional break came in December, 1975, when he was hired to play the theater pipe organ at Big Top Pizza in Carmichael, CA. He held this position until 1981. He later played the pipe organs at Pizza and Pipes, both in Sacramento and in Fresno, CA, until 1994. He started playing the organ for church services in July 1981 and has been playing almost non stop ever since. He moved to Spokane, WA, in December,


2005, after his retirement from the City of Roseville, CA, and returned to the Sacramento area last November. He and his family reside in Lincoln, CA. Currently he is organist at Lincoln Hills Community Church.

Oroville State Theatre Organ Project

Stage has purchased a 16' rank of Wurlitzer Wooden Diaphones and 16' Pedal Tibias from the Columbia River Theatre Organ Society in Portland; these will fill out the pedal division of our organ. See the photo on the left for a perspective on how large they are.

Stage is in the process of looking for donors to keep the project going. There is an admittedly idealistic goal to have the organ playing for the Theatre's 90th birthday in April of 2018.

On July 28 folks will leave for Aurora, Oregon, to pick up our new ranks; these will be unloaded onto the stage on Saturday, July 29 and will quickly be refurbished and installed on the stage walls as they are too big to store and too big to go into the chambers. These will be the first pipes to go in the theatre!! All this work must be done by September 15 so that the stage can be prepared for the first performance of the Fall season.

Contracts have been let and work has begun on the reconstruction and construction of both Pipe Organ Chambers; volunteers are already on site making preparations for the contractor (to save lots of money). One project almost completed is the removal of an abandoned LARGE HVAC fan motor. Volunteers are painting lumber and sheetrock for the necessary sealing of the back sides of the auditorium grillwork. This grill work was covered over in the 1950s and must be sealed off to be uncovered. The grills originally were part of the air conditioning system, but are not now. Volunteers will also remove old plaster walls and ducting that is still running through parts of the chamber areas.

We are going to be looking for folks who want to continue through the fall and winter rebuilding the organ chests. We hope to be putting chests in the chambers during the theatre's "down time" in January.

Fund raising is ongoing at this time: we are spending it too fast!
