

GUEST ARTIST: Bill Coale



Dr. William (Bill) Coale, Ph.D., is a retired school superintendent from Michigan who started playing theatre pipe organs approximately 35 years ago when he first encountered the 3/11 Barton "Butterfield Special" in Flint, Michigan's

Capitol Theatre. He soon became a student of the late Rev. Jim Miller and became president of the Flint Capitol Theatre Organ Club, being heard in concert on that instrument a number of times.

Bill has had the opportunity and privilege over the years to play more 30 theatre pipe organs in the

United States and England. Primarily self-taught, Bill has a particular interest in ragtime music and marches. In addition to his twenty years as a band and choir director, he also conducted a professional concert band, as well as conducting and performing in the pit orchestras for many musical theatre productions. He also served as a church choir director for over a decade.

After completing his doctorate in Educational Leadership in 2005, Bill re-entered the theatre organ hobby after a long period of inactivity and purchased his Allen GW-319 digital theatre organ, now in his El Cerrito residence. He currently owns an educational consulting business, and does his best to act as though he's really not retired. He is delighted to get back on the bench after that long hiatus, hopefully to the enjoyment of the wonderful members and guests of the Sierra Chapter ATOS.

About the George A. Seaver Memorial Pipe Organ

George A. Seaver expressed a dream for Sierra Chapter to possess its own theatre pipe organ, but he died in 1972 before his dream could become true. In 1974, Sierra Chapter purchased Larry Weid's home organ, a two-manual, seven rank, style E Wurlitzer (Opus 0939). This organ, originally from the Palace Theatre in San Leandro, was installed in the Golden Bear Playhouse at Cal Expo. When the Playhouse was converted into exhibit space, Dale Mendenhall made arrangements to have the organ installed at the Fair Oaks Community Clubhouse. The work was done by thirty volunteers, led by Dave Moreno and Dale Mendenhall, and completed in March, 1981.

The organ has gone through many changes, improvements and additions. A three manual Robert Morton Console, once owned by Hollywood musician Buddy Cole, was donated by Sierra Member Steve Restivo from San Jose. The old relay system was replaced with a Z-tronic multiplex system, and an English Post Horn and Tuba Horn were added, bringing the organ to its present thirteen ranks of pipes.




