Dave Moreno has had an extensive background in playing the theatre organ, beginning when he was just 13. He's equally comfortable with silent movie accompaniment, solo music of the 1920's -1950's and jazz organ.

Over the past 30 years Dave has played in many of the great remaining vintage theatres and organ restaurants like the Pizza and Pipes in Sacramento.

As unique as his style is, so is his fashionable appearance. Moreno is an avid collector of vintage platform shoes, most from the 1970's, and his collection is currently over 600 pairs! You'll likely see his favorite pair of the day, busy on the organ's pedal board during his performance! *He's quite the showman!*

The picture at left pretty much says it all. When you think of **Harold Lloyd**, this is the image that comes to mind. Do NOT miss it!

A young man named Harold leaves his small home town of Great Bend to head to the big city so that he can earn enough money to marry his sweetheart, Mildred. He finds that life in the big city is more difficult than he imagined, only managing to get a low paying sales clerk job at De Vore's Department Store. He even has to share a room with his pal Bill to make ends meet. In the meantime, he writes letters home to Mildred, telling her that he has a great job, and to be patient as he will soon be able to send for her, which is the farthest thing from the truth. He even sends her gifts which he can ill afford. Harold gets into one misadventure after another as he works on not getting fired. His life gets more complicated as Mildred makes a surprise visit into the city, which makes his task of masquerading as a high powered businessman even more difficult, while still trying to do his job under the watchful and critical eye of the department store's head floorwalker, Mr. Stubbs. Harold thinks all his prayers are answered when, after overhearing a conversation with De Vore's General Manager, he comes up with a scheme to make enough money to get married using Bill's special skills. But Harold may have to use those skills himself in order to carry out that scheme.

2019 Convention Dallas, Texas July 14 - July 18

This convention will feature over 12 beautiful venues. The region is home to several major universities, but much of our time will be spent at two: the Southern Methodist University campus, across the highway from the convention's hotel, boasts an active organ program with numerous fine instruments by Dobson, Aeolian-Skinner, C.B. Fisk, and Hook & Hastings. A highlight here is the Meadows Museum which features the largest collection of Iberian art outside of Spain, and just so happens to house the state's oldest pipe organ, originally at Evora Cathedral. Our time at SMU will be shared with The Hymn Society of

the United States and Canada, the collaboration with whom will include a shared plenary session. The University of North Texas in Denton, a northern regional suburb, will host the OHS on another day as we experience the numerous concert organs on campus. Where else can one hear a 1949 Möller and a 1986 Bedient French classical organ in the same auditorium, not to mention a historic Swiss/German organ with Texas roots of over a century?
