Civic Auditorium, San Gabriel Mission Playhouse, The Bob Baker Marionette Theatre and the magnificent Orpheum Theatre, one of Los Angeles' great movie palaces.

At his own request, Edward Torres, originally from Culver City, California, asked his parents to let him study music at eight years of age. He was inspired further by the recordings of Everett Nourse at the Wurlitzer of the FOX Theatre, San Francisco.

At 14 years of age, a trip to El Segundo's Old Town Music Hall introduced him, in-person, to the impressive sound of the theatre organ. By 15, he became the protégé of organist Bill Field. Through Field's generosity and teachings, Torres at 21 became the organist at the Old Town Music Hall. He currently serves as house organist at the famed and historic Bob Baker Marionette Theater in Los Angeles.

A former student of the American Theatre Organ Society Summer Youth Program, which holds a yearly theatre organ workshops for young/aspiring theatre organists, he currently teaches piano for the Los Angeles County Parks and Recreation Department when not touring the United States to play the remaining remarkable theatre organs and the venues that house them.

The console was originally installed in the St. Petersburg Florida Paramount Theatre in 1926. **Dave Moreno** completed the installation of the organ into Hunter Hall in 2010.

Directions: Take I-5 towards Lodi and exit at Hwy 12 West towards Rio Vista. When you cross over the Rio Vista Bridge (the big drawbridge) take the first off ramp, keep to the right and go under the bridge and head south along the river on Front Street. You will come to a 4-way stop sign (Main St.). Keep going south two more blocks to California Street, turn right and go one block. The Hall is on the right, at the corner of California and Second Street. Hunter Hall is the L shaped building. Parking is on the street. Allow about 1 1/4 hr. from the Sacramento area.

Scenic Route: Take I-5 towards Lodi and exit at Twin Cities Road (west). Drive past the TV towers, and turn left (south) onto Hwy 160 (River Road). Continue on Hwy 160 to Hwy 12 and turn right onto the Rio Vista Bridge, then follow directions above.

Adventure Route: Take Hwy 50/I-80 to West Sacramento and exit at Jefferson Blvd. Continue south on Jefferson Blvd (Hwy 84) to Courtland Rd and turn right. Then a left onto Ryer Ave and continue a few miles on the delta levies. Then right onto the Ryer Island Ferry. Note - Ferry is free and runs every 20 minutes. Exit Ferry and turn left onto River Rd. Turn left on Front Street, and follow directions above.

Several of our long time members had some great visits with Gary at the ATOS convention in Chicago. Gary currently lives in La Crosse Wisconsin. So, below is a bit of nostalgia for our old time members.

Theatre Organ Magazine February/March 1980 VOX POPS Section

From Sacramento, **Gary Konas** reports that in 1979, Sierra Chapter's Seaver Memorial Organ was used more and heard by more people than ever before since its installation in Sacramento 's Golden Bear Playhouse in 1974. The history of this 2/7 Wurlitzer has been given previously (THEATRE ORGAN Dec. 1974 and April 1975). This past year thousands of people outside of ATOS heard theatre organ music, perhaps for the first time, played on the only theatre pipe organ located at a California State Fair in Sacramento (running from mid August through Labor Day.) Two "cameo concerts" were played daily in the Playhouse by the club members and local pros. Thanks to advertising, attendance was excellent, with full houses on several occasions. Total attendance was over 6,000 and as a result, several people decided to join ATOS.

This past December a local group staged the musical, *Scrooge*, at the Playhouse. A small group of Sierra Chapter volunteers, organized by **Randy Warwick**, took turns playing Christmas music on the organ before each of the 18 performances and at intermission. Thanks to these efforts another 4,000 people were able to hear a pipe organ in a theatre atmosphere.
