16th Annual George Wright **Memorial Concert**



The four-manual twenty-one rank theatre pipe organ at Grant Union High School was installed over a period of one year from 1938 to 1939. Pipe work and chests were obtained from theatre organs in Redding and San Francisco,

California, and Reno, Nevada. The best parts were used to assemble the organ by students under the direction of Fred Wood, an organ builder from Oakland. The new Grant organ was presented to the public in a recital by Emil Martin, Howard Scott, and George Wright on December 8, 1939.

Donna Parker, a native of Los Angeles, California, began her organ studies at the age of 7. Four years later she was introduced to the theatre organ and, at thirteen,

began her classical organ instruction with Richard Purvis, Organist and Master of Choristers Emeritus and Honorary Canon of San Francisco's famed Grace Cathedral.

Donna attended California Polytechnic State University at Pomona, California, majoring in organ. Subsequently, she moved to Phoenix, Arizona, where she performed at Organ Stop Pizza. This began an association that would last for many years with restaurants centered around entertainment on large theatre pipe organs, including The Roaring 20s in Grand Rapids, Michigan, Paramount Music Palace in Indianapolis, Indiana, The Organ Grinder in Portland, Oregon, Uncle Milt's in Vancouver, Washington, and Organ Stop Pizza in Phoenix and Mesa, Arizona.

Donna has actively promoted the theatre pipe organ art form over the years including television appearances on CBS Sunday Morning with Charles Kuralt, PM Magazine, and numerous entertainment news spots. She has conducted master classes nationally and abroad, and has worked with public school districts to incorporate this all-American art form into their music history curriculum. In 1996 Donna was honored by being named Organist of the Year by the American Theatre Organ Society. She was elected to serve on the international board of directors of the ATOS for six years, where she headed the scholarship committee that assisted students studying theatre organ. After a hiatus, she is once again serving on the board as the Publisher of the Theatre Organ journal--the official publication of ATOS, as the Public Relations chair, and as a core faculty member of the ATOS Summer Youth Camp. Donna also manages a limited

private teaching and coaching schedule as well.

Donna has numerous highly acclaimed recordings to her credit including her latest release, "The Lady Elsinore." Her concert performances take her to well-known venues across the United States and abroad. International appearances include Canada, Vienna, Austria--where she performed for a national broadcast on the ORF--Australia, New Zealand, and Japan--where she had the distinction of performing the first organ concert at Tokyo's famed Casals Concert Hall.

king theatre organ music to a whole new audience. Donna performed at the Tropicana Casino and Hotel in Atlantic City, New Jersey, for two years where she provided daily holiday concerts in The Quarter, and has performed as a staff organist at the El Capitan Theatre in Hollywood for the Walt Disney Company. Donna was invited to perform at Scotty's Castle in Death Valley, California, the only National Park with a pipe organ.

In 2009, Donna performed as featured soloist with the Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra for the Yuletide Celebration Concert

series on the newly installed Wurlitzer theatre pipe organ at the Hilbert Circle Theatre in Indianapolis. She returned for the 2010 Christmas season which marked the series' 25th anniversary with the Maestro Jack Everly conducting and guest host Sandi Patty. This is the second largest Christmas concert series in the United States, second only to Radio City Music Hall in New York.

Diane Bish is the most visible and influential classical organist performing today. Concert and recording artist, composer, conductor, and international television personality, Diane Bish has displayed her dazzling virtuosity and unique showmanship the world over to international acclaim. Her performances have been hailed by critics as stunning, virtuoso, fiery, and astonishing.

Miss Bish's television program The Joy of Music is broadcast to over 300 million people around the world each week. The show combines exhilarating organ and ensem-

ble performances with an informative, inspirational narrative and exciting world travel. After twenty-five years of continuous broadcast, The Joy of Music is one of the longest running television programs still in production with new programs taped, edited and broadcast each year. The Joy of Music library boasts over 500 episodes featuring famous cathedrals, concert halls, churches and organs.

Miss Bish has recorded on the foremost organs of the world and was the first American woman to record on the four organs of Freiburg Cathedral, Germany. Featured on over 30 of her recordings are music for organ and orchestra, brass and organ, great organ masterpieces, organ and harp, original works, and hymn arrangements.

The sparkling creativity and artistry of Diane Bish is equally evident in her compositions. She has composed numerous solo pieces, arrangements, and full symphonic works which have received much acclaim and are performed regularly due to her ability to combine musical quality with accessibility.

A couple of boxes will be at the Christmas party.


