About the Film: Dr Jekyl I and Mr Hyde

The film was directed by John S. Robertson, starred John Barrymore and co-starred Nita Naldi. Based on Robert Louis Stevenson's often adapted 1886 socially conscious horror novella, this version stars the incomparable John Barrymore as Dr. Henry Jekyll, a gentle, saintly Victorian physician. When the good Dr. Jekyll meets the diabolical Sir George Carew, the father of his fiancée, Millicent, Carew is "piqued" by Dr. Jekyll. "No man could be as good as he looks," Carew says. He goads Jekyll who becomes fascinated by the dark side of the human psyche. The sinfully seductive Miss Gina arouses more of Jekyll's sexual and sociopathic longings. Determined to explore the dark side of consciousness without endangering himself, Jekyll concocts a potion that transforms him into Edward Hyde, an uninhibited rogue whom Barrymore brilliantly brings to life. With Jekyll's initial transformation into Hyde was achieved with no



makeup, instead relying solely on Barrymore's ability to contort his face and the help of only artificial teeth and fingers. Jekyll finds that it is becoming harder and harder to separate his two personalities,

sending him into a downward spiral that seems destined to end with the destruction of his former identity. **GUEST ARTIST**
